Lent Message from the Pastor Fr. Dwayne McNew



Dear parish family,

We all need some joy in our lives sometimes, especially in the dreary time of winter. We need something that can give us a boost and transfigure our

In the Middle Ages during the Black Plague when one-third of Europe was dying, a small book was written entitled The Imitation of Christ. It helped people reach beyond the constant death that surrounded them and look to heaven as their goal. Even today, this little book continues to be a consolation for those who suffer.

Today, as every Second Sunday in Lent, we reflect on the Transfiguration. In the midst of the disciples' fears, Jesus reveals to them a tiny sliver of what the Resurrection will be like. No one actually saw the Resurrection, but if they did it would look a little like the Transfiguration. The unfolding of Salvation history in a glimpse. There are Moses and Elijah representing the Hebrew tradition. There are James, Peter, and John, the future writers, preachers, Pope and leaders of the new Church. There is God in the mystery of a voice coming from a cloud. There is Christ in glory; without any LED lights, he shines brightly on top of that mountain. The vision gives the apostles hope to carry them through the journey from ashes to the Easter Resurrection.

It is possible for us to have Transfiguration moments in our lives a glimpse of God in our world today. Let our prayer be, "Lord, transfigure me!"

CRS RICE BOWL: Majd's Story: Eight-year-old Majd thought his family was going on a picnic. His mother, BOWL Lamya, said they would be back home in a week. But when

ISIS attacked their home in northern Iraq, the family fled for good. "What worried me the most were the kids," Lamya says. "Our life was stable and we were doing well; we had a very big house. Our children had everything they needed. But when we fled, I was not able to bring anything for them – not even food. "Fortunately, the family found an apartment to rent with other displaced families. It is much smaller than the home they had, but it's safer. The children enrolled in a CRS-sponsored school, where the routine provides hope, stability and a sense of belonging. "Education is very important," says Lamya, especially in Iraqi culture. Lamya received training from CRS and became a teacher at the school. Now she has hope for the future. "I really love children, so when I go to class, I feel like I am with my family," she says. Her son, Majd, also loves going to school. "Majd is so motivated to go to school. He just wants it to be morning so he can go," Lamya says. "He is relaxed, having fun and more confident."
