THE BLESSING OF HOMES

The custom of blessing homes on Epiphany developed because the feast commemorates the time that the Three Magi visited the home of Jesus, Mary and Joseph. Traditionally, after the blessing, the initials of their names were written in chalk on the lintel above the



front door. The series of numbers, letters and crosses will read as follows:

20+C+M+B+24

The letters have two meanings. They are the initials of the traditional names of the **Caspar, Melchior,** and **Balthasar**. They also abbreviate the Lation words "Christus Mansionem Benedicat," which means "May Christ bless this home." The letters recall the day on which the inscription is made, as well as the purpose of the blessing. The crosses represent Christ, who we invoke. The inscription is made above the front door, so that all who enter and depart this year may enjoy God's blessing. The inscription is made of chalk, a product of clay, which recalls the human nature taken by God's eternal word in this holy season. With time, the chalk will fade. As it does, we let the meaning of the symbols written sink into the depths of our heart and be manifest in our words and actions.

JANUARY IS PRO-LIFE MONTH: January is STILL Pro-Life Month! Bishop Fernandes reminds us that despite the disappointing passage of Issue 1 in November, the Diocese of Columbus will continue "to build a culture of life and a civilization of love" in the Central Ohio area (The Catholic Times 12/17/23). He encourages all the faithful to deeper prayer, fasting, and almsgiving for the protection of life from the moments of conception to natural death. How? He asks us to continue praying regularly for reparation of sins against human life and dignity, to abstain from meat on all Fridays of this year as a personal sacrifice, and to support mothers in difficult situations. To this end, our January Pro-Life action will be the collection of diapers of any size and baby wipes for two approved organizations on the Westside of Columbus: Birthright International and Pregnancy Decision Health Centers. In addition, there are Pro-Life materials on the counter in the Gathering Space, provided by the Women's Guild. Together our combined efforts will speak for those who cannot speak for themselves!
