

every time he gets hurt, which is throughout the entire movie. Even though he is beaten up, the hero, in many movies, goes on as if the wounds aren't even there. Any of us who has bruised a rib, broken a finger, cut ourselves, or stubbed a toe knows that this movie magic is not true. The wound hurts! We limp, breath delicately, cradle your hurt finger for protection. And when the doctor draws blood from me, I pass out. Unlike Hollywood, the real world does not allow us to live easily with physical or emotional wounds.

When Jesus asks us to take up our cross, we are challenged to take hold of our life and all it contains, including the many old wounds that still hurt us. As we journey to the cross of Good Friday, remember to let go of the wounds and bask in the Glory of the Resurrection.

We pray: Lord, I place my hope in you. Help me this Lent to embrace life and carry my cross. Amen.

SUPPORTING OUR SEMINARIANS: On behalf of the entire parish, our PSR students in grades 4-7 recently created encouragement cards to send to the 37 Diocese of Columbus Seminarians studying at the Josephinum and other places in Ohio. The Women's Guild included a

coffee gift card in each. Last year, we only had 24 seminarians. The Women's Guild has also contributed an additional **\$500.00** cash to help with expenses for the seminarians. Keep praying for an increase in Vocations. It's obviously working!



THE SEMINARIAN FUNDING EFFORT:

At Bishop Fernandes' Ordination and Installation Mass, he spoke of two priorities, Evangelization and Vocations. Many hours of work and prayer have gone into raising awareness about the virtue and beauty of the priesthood and the need for vocations. The result has been an influx of 16 additional young men interested in the priesthood!

Seminarian formation costs \$55k per year, per seminarian. Though an endowment for evangelization and seminarian tuition is being established for the long term, this push will be for the Diocese's immediate budgetary needs due to the increased interest.

Calling on the laity, we want to amplify this good and growing need. A SECOND COLLECTION will take place the weekend of February 24 and 25.
